LEIGH MELROSE Baritone

In recent years, Leigh Melrose has carved out a formidable reputation for the performance of new works. His excellent sense of rhythm, fearless vocal flexibility and engaging stage presence mark him out as one of the most sought after singers for this challenging work.

A wonderfully dynamic artist on both the concert and opera platform Leigh is also in demand for core repertoire from Brahms to Berg and Mahler to Mozart.

A graduate of St John's College, Cambridge, and the Royal Academy of Music, his opera engagements have taken him to companies all over the world where he has sung Demetrius *A Midsummer Night's Dream* for La Monnaie, Escamillo *Carmen* at the Royal Albert Hall and with CBSO/Sakari Oramo, Figaro *II Barbiere di Siviglia* at New York City Opera, Silvio *I Pagliacci* for Welsh National Opera, Britten's *Death in Venice*, Liceu Barcelona, Papageno *The Magic Flute* and Marcello *La bohème* for Opera Zuid, Sid *Albert Herring*, Salzburger Landestheater and for the Opéra Comique and Opera de Rouen, the title role in *Eugene Onegin*, Longborough Festival Opera and Ned Keene *Peter Grimes*, Papageno *The Magic Flute*, The Count *Marriage of Figaro*, Rodolfo Leoncavallo's *La bohème* and Junius *The Rape of Lucretia* for English National Opera.

In the contemporary field Leigh has given many world premieres including most recently Elliot Carter's *On Conversing with Paradise* at the Aldeburgh Festival under Oliver Knussen and Evan in James MacMillan's new opera *The Sacrifice* at Welsh National Opera, both to critical acclaim. He has also sung Punch in Birtwistle's *Punch and Judy* in Porto, Rambo in the Channel Four film of John Adams' *The Death of Klinghoffer*, roles in Jonathan Dove's TV Opera, *Man on the Moon* for Channel 4, Xenakis *Ais*with the BBC Symphony Orchestra at the Proms and Berlin Festival and Peter Maxwell Davies *The Martyrdom of St Magnus* at the composer's St Magnus Festival, Orkney, in Edinburgh and Inverness.

Concert performances have included *Belshazzar's Feast*, Berlioz' Symphony No.3 and *The Death of Klinghoffer* with the BBC Symphony Orchestra, *Les Troyens* with LSO/Colin, Britten *Canticles* at the Liceu Barcelona and with Roger Vignoles at the Queen Elizabeth Hall and the Wigmore Hall in London, Fauré *Requiem* with the Northern Sinfonia and Thierry Fischer, De Falla's *La Vida Breve* at the BBC Proms, works by Mozart and Salieri with the City of London Sinfonia at the Mostly Mozart Festival at the Barbican, and *Carmina Burana* in Birmingham Symphony Hall, at Usher Hall and with the RTE National Symphony Orchestra of Ireland.

Future plans include Ned Keane *Peter Grimes* for the Vlaamse Opera and Opera Oviedo (David Alden production from ENO) Papageno *Die Zauberflöte* for Seattle Opera, Second Apprentice *Wozzeck* in concert with the Philharmonia Orchestra and Esa-Pekka Salonen in London and Paris, the world premiere of Johannes Kalitzke's *Die Besessenen* at Theater an der Wien, concerts with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic and Vassily Petrenko, the Scottish Chamber Orchestra and the Hebrides Ensemble.
